# **FALL SEMESTER:**

### • Think about job/careers/colleges that interest you:

# College Search:

- Start thinking about colleges that you want to attend.

#### PSAT – October:

 This is the year when you take the Practice SAT and it will count towards the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (NMSQT).

# **SPRING SEMESTER:**

#### SAT or ACT:

- Register for the SAT or ACT You should take at least one test prior to the start
  of your senior year. Look under the Testing Information & Study Materials on the
  SHS Counseling page for resources. Register at collegeboard.org or act.org
- Stop by the counselor's office if you are on free/reduced lunch. You can use a fee waiver for the SAT test.
- When you register for a test, you can put down the colleges where you want to attend so your scores will be sent there.

# College Search:

 Continue researching colleges and narrow down your options. You can begin applying to colleges on July 1<sup>st</sup> of your senior year.

### College Tours:

The state allows Salado High School Juniors and Seniors four days each year for you to visit a college of your choice. (These days are exempt for you, only with a complete form from the high school a week ahead of time of visit and a letter from the college or university).
